

# SERVICE FOR THE LORD'S DAY

## THE GATHERING

The Service begins outside, on the patio in front of the church

#### GREETING

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

#### CALL TO WORSHIP

BASED ON LUKE 19:18-40

The whole multitude of disciples praise God joyfully, saying:

For every deed of power we have seen, blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven, and glory to God in the highest.

If these were silent, the very stones would cry out. Let us worship God.

#### OPENING PRAYER

We praise you, O God, for the redemption earned by Jesus Christ. He came into Jerusalem in triumph. He was called Messiah and king. The people greeted him with honor along the way. We carry branches today as signs of his victory. Grant that we may follow him on the way to the cross and may enter into your kingdom in celebration of Christ. **Amen.** 

# PROCLAMATION OF THE ENTRANCE INTO JERUSALEM (Responsive)

When Jesus had finished his teaching, he went on to Jerusalem. As he was getting near the Mount of Olives, he sent two disciples on ahead. He said,

"Go into the next village, where you will find a young donkey that has never been ridden. Untie the donkey and bring it here. If anyone asks why you are doing this, just say 'The Lord needs it.'"

They went off and found everything just as Jesus had said. While they were untying the donkey, its owners asked,

"Why are you doing that?"

They answered,

# "The Lord needs it."

Then they led the donkey to Jesus. And as he rode along, the people celebrated God because of all the miracles they had seen. They shouted,

"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory to God."

Some in the crowd said to Jesus,

"Teacher, make your disciples stop shouting!"

But Jesus answered,

"If they keep quiet, these stones will start shouting."

The people enter the church singing. We are a throng; we do not need to walk in single file. You can wave your palm branches as you come!


