

OPENING VOLUNTARY

GREETING

Early on the first day of the week, the disciples of Jesus went to the tomb where he had been buried only to find that the stone had been rolled away, and the tomb was empty. We gather here as Jesus' disciples, on the first day of the week, to celebrate the good news: Jesus Christ is risen today!

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

*CALL TO WORSHIP

People, we are witnesses!

Christ has died. Christ is raised. Christ will come again in glory! This is the good news.

Jesus Christ, whose ministry we loved, has been raised. He lives! Let us worship God.

God whom death could not conquer, and whom the tomb could not hold: we praise you for winning our redemption. You raised Jesus, and your love lifts our hearts. Grant to us the great Easter certainty of everlasting life, that we may worship you forever; through Jesus Christ, our risen Savior. Amen.

CALL TO RECONCILIATION

Gracious God, we know the truth; that you rolled away the stone from the tomb and Christ is alive!

Still we look for the living among the dead and are overcome with how wrong we are.

A brief silence is kept for personal confession.

Forgive us, we pray. Trust us to trust your promise and to believe the good news of salvation:

The resurrection of Christ has made us well! Amen.

We are united with Christ in a baptism like his. Remember your baptism and give thanks! **Amen.**

Choir: *Patrick Ritsch* If you love to sing, consider our Chancel Choir. Our choir practices on Wednesday evenings and sings for weekly and special services.

Companions Ministry: *Debbie McCoy* Every member has a Companion. These are compassionate volunteers who are in regular contact with one or more church goers by phone, email, mail, or in person.

Church Workdays: *Tom Furlong* One Saturday in Spring, Summer and Fall, we work together on tasks both inside and outside the church building. Together we cleanup, fixup, and beautify our spaces.

Greeter, Liturgist/Communion: *Marilyn Ericksen* Greeters welcome church goers on Sunday mornings at our Griffith Ave. and Clinton Place doors. Liturgists lead prayer, read scriptures & serve bread. Servers offer the cup.

Kid's Kirk: *Stephanie Dube* Engaging children in the Sunday Bible story using language and activities they understand. During the sermon time.

Kitchen Clean Up: *Just Come* With every church meal there is set up and clean up. Many hands make short work. Come to the kitchen and pitch in.

Marketing and Publicity: *Marilyn Ericksen* Come help with writing, photos, news outlet interface and social media content. Creatives and Techies wanted!

Office Volunteer: *Debbie Hutchinson* At times we need people to answer phones/take messages in the church office for two-hour shifts.

Sunday Nursery Care: *Jerry Price* On a rotating basis, during worship & special events, we offer nursery care for children ages 0-4. Volunteers serve on a rotating basis.

Vacation Bible School: *Stephanie Dube* Held in June or July, you can help for one day or all 4 days with storytelling, music, crafts or snacks.

Mission: *Allison Bates* Provides leadership and vision for targeted giving and personal involvement with hungry, homeless, and struggling_people in our city, county, and beyond.

Outreach & Evangelism: *Marilyn Ericksen* Responsible for welcome and hospitality. Promotes our core belief that *all are welcome*. Oversees information sharing with news outlets and social media, i.e., church marketing and publicity.

Personnel: *Jerry Price* Responsible for engaging, assessing, and supporting church staff, includes maintaining relevant documents.

Property: *Tom Furlong* Responsible for the care and maintenance of our church's physical and technological space. Coordinates volunteer church workdays.

Worship & Music: *Marilyn Ericksen* Production and vision that supports the worship life of the congregation: leaders and crew for communion, liturgical art, sound, recording and livestream.
